### Program description

The program's goal is to give comprehensive training in topics of sustainable development, environmental governance, natural resource management, and environmental conflict resolution from both an ecological and social standpoint. Food Systems, Water Management, Forestry, Coastal Resources, Climate Change, Urban Ecology, and Social Movements are among the topics covered. The program focuses on the human dimensions of the environment-development nexus, emphasizing the links between local perspectives and broader processes at the national, regional, and global levels, and emphasizing the importance of political economic structures and resource inequality as key drivers in environmental conflict and global environmental change.
